Dear Sean,

On Thursday, May 25, at a little past noon, I spread Dan's ashes from the top of Parliament Hill, on a place overlooking all of London. It is from that point that you look to see if the dome of St. Paul's is visible, and then turn yourself in the direction of Boadicea's tomb, Jack Straw's Castle, the Spaniards, and Kenwood.

To find the place, walk to the top of Parliament Hill, put your back to the marker with the silhouette of London, and walk forward a dozen paces. On your right you will see the hills and churches of Highgate, and straight ahead the grove of trees you must aim for if you want to find the Spaniards.

It was a fine Spring day with a little cool in the air, good walking weather. On top of the Heath I encountered some walkers who held "The Perfect London Walk," and it turned out they were friends of Dan's--the head of the French Department, his wife, and the widow of a colleague of Dan's. I am sending Audrey a photo I took; she may be able to identify them. At the other end of the Heath, as we were having our lunch at the Spaniards, we met another group using the book. So Dan continues to show the way.
